Exterior Projects in the Historic District:

As Spring approaches, remember that exterior restoration projects may require a Certificate of Appropriateness issued by the Historical and Cultural Preservation Commission.

Exterior maintenance such as painting, roof replacement with like material (roof replacement requires a building permit city wide), and general repairs with like material, do not require Commission approval.

Examples of projects requiring approval: replacing or adding any windows or doors, removing architectural elements (some roofing jobs can involve this so be careful), room additions, decks, major landscaping, garage construction, sidewalks, fencing, etc.

If in doubt, call the City Planning office at 648-6163. they are always very helpful and will assist you in developing a plan that meets current district guidelines.
